

Macaulay Park Proposed Improvements Engagement outcomes

Macaulay Park is a highly valued public open space in the Inglewood community. It provides a diverse range of social and play opportunities including a playground, barbeques and grassed areas for informal play and relaxation.

The City of Stirling is proposing recreational improvements to deliver a more active and vibrant Macaulay Park.

In December 2023 - February 2024 the City shared the concept plan with the community during round two feedback to explore what is important to the local park users. The City distributed letters to residents within 800m of the park and project signage invited the community to get involved and participate in drop-in sessions on Thursday 14 December 2023 and Thursday 18 January 2024.

"The basketball courts!! Because all 15 of my friends who play basketball always come to mine and want to play basketball but we can't."

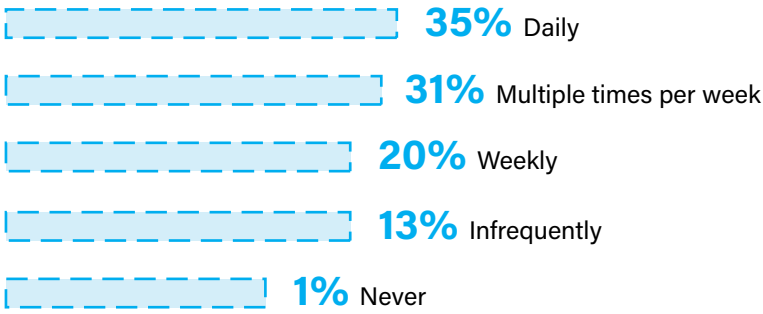
"Additional tree planting. Nature play area amongst existing trees with mulched surface and possibly the tricycle/ scooter path."

"The idea of fitness area in one zone is better because give us the opportunity of use all equipment in short time."

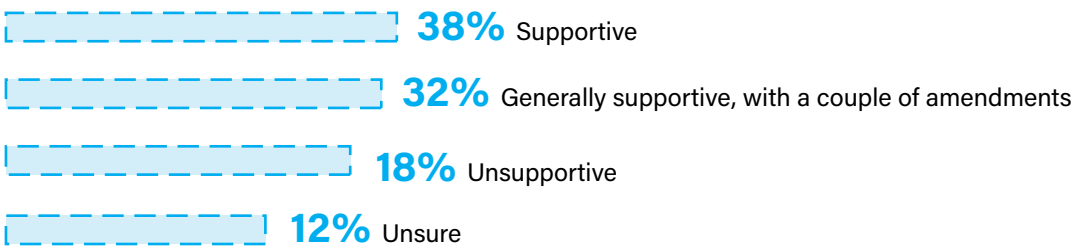

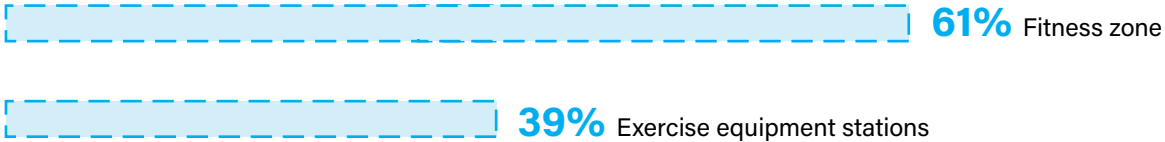
How often do you visit Macaulay Park?



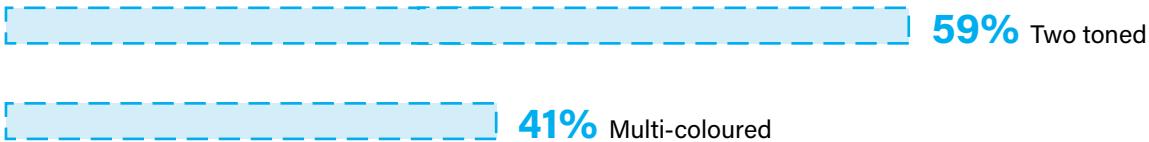
Having viewed the proposed concept design, how do you feel about the design?
