Does the tree(s) for nomination meet the following criteria?

- Is the tree(s) being nominated, a woody perennial plant generally having a single stem or trunk which will grow to a height of 4m or more? (Note: Palms and Cactus do not qualify).
- Not a known species identified as a weed by the Biosecurity and Agricultural Management Act 2007 (<https://www.agric.wa.gov.au/bam/biosecurity-and-agriculture-management-act-2007>).
- Is of a significant size for the species typically meeting one or more off the following:
 - i. Diameter at Breast Height of at least 250mm, or;
 - ii. Canopy diameter spread of at least 10m, or;
 - iii. Height of at least 4m.

Information Required to support the application

Please provide the following information as an attachment to this form:

- Photos of the tree(s).

Please provide at least three current photos of each nominated tree. Ensure photos are of good quality but not greater than 2MB each, in focus, and clearly show the below features:

- Close-up of features such as flowers, fruit, nuts, leaves or cones;

- Entire tree (excluding its surroundings as much as possible);
- Entire tree including its surroundings, that places it in context.

(Helpful tips: When photographing the tree, try not to have the sun behind the tree).

- Site Plan (or Google Maps Plan) indicating location of the tree(s) within the site including the distance to boundaries, buildings and structures.
- Any additional information to support your nomination (e.g. cover letter, media articles, historical information, arboriculturist report).

Landowner's Consent

The City of Stirling will not consider a nomination without the landowner(s) consent. Where the nominated tree's structural root zone(s), extends into an adjoining site consent from the adjoining landowner(s) must also be obtained when nominating tree(s).

To determine the extent of the structural root zone for nomination purposes, the following guide is provided:

- \underline{Xx} Diameter at Breast height (DBH) x 12 = \underline{xx} radius (example: where the DBH is 50cm x 12 = 600cm or 6m).

Measure outwards from the tree trunk the calculated radius and if this extends into an adjoining site it is likely that the structural root zone also extends into the adjoining site. Meaning the adjoining landowner consent is required for the nomination.

By providing consent, the landowner and/or adjoining landowner acknowledges that a s70a notification will be lodged on the property's Certificate of Title where the tree(s) are approved for registration on the Significant Tree Register.
