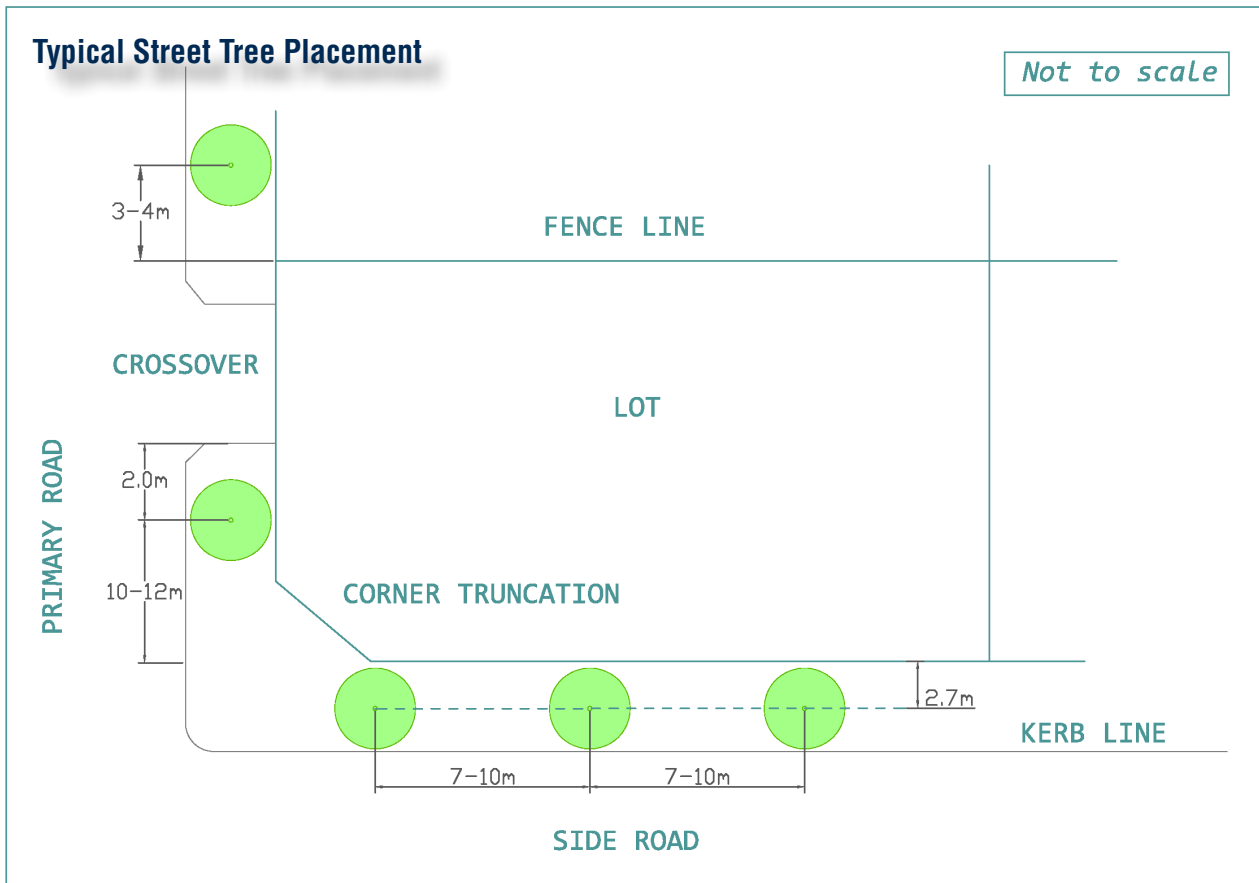
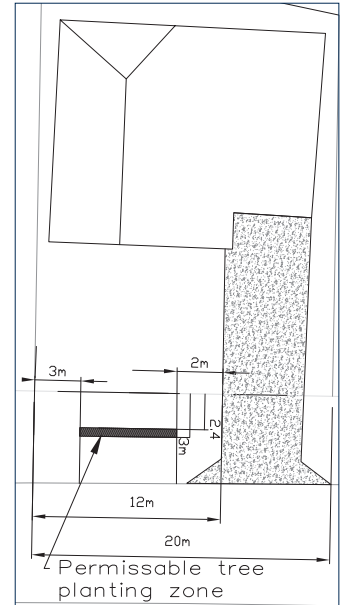


There is a set alignment that street trees are planted in, in accordance with the *Utility Service Providers Code of Practice*, generally 2.4 – 3 m from the front property boundary, 2.7m ideally.

This alignment can usually be identified by existing street trees or other above ground services such as power poles. The front property line can usually be identified by letterbox position, and changes to driveway crossovers.

Trees are generally planted centrally to property boundaries or best fit to existing infrastructure ie crossovers/retic.

There is some flexibility where trees are laterally placed along this alignment so long as the following distances are maintained:



- Trees are planted in a set alignment of 2.4 – 3m from property boundary (2.7m ideally)
- > 2m from driveways
- > 3m from side property boundaries
- > 3 from services – ie power poles, inspection pits
- > 2m from hydrants to allow access

Planting is avoided closer than 10-12 metres to the corner of a block on the continuing road at any road intersection unless traffic sight lines can be maintained.
